PLAYING IT SAFE BREWERIES & DISTILLERIES

Personal Protective Equipment

Protect yourself from common brewery and distillery exposures.

Workers in the brewery and distillery industries are commonly exposed to toxic chemicals, hazardous vapors and boiling water on a regular basis. Wearing proper personal protective equipment (PPE) is the last line of defense when performing routine, yet dangerous brewing jobs. Still, many brewers are repeatedly cited for not providing proper PPE as required by OSHA.

Although employers are responsible for providing PPE, employees have a responsibility as well—to wear it. The items mentioned here are common types of PPE for brewery and distillery operations.

Eye Protection

Safety glasses and goggles can protect the eyes from flying objects and chemical splashes.

- Eye protection should have side shields or a wrap-around design to fully protect both eyes.
- Eye protection should fit over prescription eyewear.

Hand Protection

Gloves should be used for both chemical and nonchemical purposes.

- Assign gloves to specific tasks and label them accordingly to avoid cross-contamination.
- Do not use latex, vinyl or partially coated fabric gloves with chemicals.

• Promptly replace gloves that have punctures, rips or cracks.

Clothing

Clothing should cover the torso, legs and arms, and should be made of material that protects the body from physical, thermal and chemical hazards.

- Clothing should be void of large tool loops that can catch on protruding devices such as valve handles.
- If possible, clothing should be waterand chemical-repellent.
- Fabric should be light, breathable and easy to wash.

Footwear

Proper footwear can protect feet and ankles from corrosive chemicals, hot fluids and physical injury. It should also have the following characteristics:

- Steel reinforcement in the toe area
- Ankle coverage
- Slip-resistant soles

Other Protection

Hearing and respiratory protection may also be required for certain tasks. Each workplace should have specific programs in place for hearing and respiratory protection as recommended by OSHA's Occupational Noise Exposure standard and Respiratory Protection standard, respectively.
